Founded in 1968, Aptos High School is one of three comprehensive high schools in the Pajaro Valley Unified School District. Aptos High is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges and serves approximately 1450 students in grades 9-12. 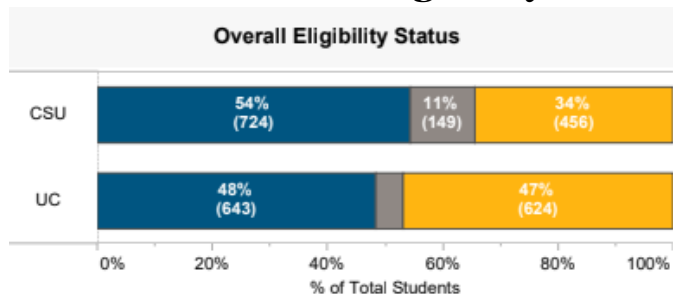
